OLD BUSINESS

• Safe Routes to School: Update

City Administrator Jones gave an update on the Safe Routes to School project and informed the Council that several property owners have turned in their Temporary Construction Easement forms. Administrator Jones also said that a second round of mailings was also sent out.

NEW BUSINESS

Council Grove Area Trade & Tourism Association: Presentation

Zoey Bond the Executive Director of the Council Grove Area Trade and Tourism Association gave an update to the Council regarding the marketing effort. Mrs. Bond said that there has been a 27% increase in merchants belonging to the association for a total of 163 members. Mrs. Bond said that the new website is complete and gives a new presence for both the association and the city, along with the new visitor's guide, which has been well received. Facebook indicated analytics said there have been over 90,000 impressions over the last month and that there has been 32 articles written in the Republican and 86 events posted. Mrs. Bond said she is working on marketing plan for the naming of the Neosho Riverwalk Amphitheater along with four proposed welcome signs as people come into town.

• USD417 Homecoming Parade Request:

City Administrator Jones presented USD417 request to block off a portion of Main Street on October 6^{th} from approximately 2:00-2:30pm for the annual Homecoming Parade starting on Railroad Street to Chautauqua. Councilperson Sean Honer made a motion to approve the request. The motion was seconded by Councilperson Jason Booker. Motion carried 5-0

Alcohol Consumption and Sale at Community Events Application: Sethfest
Renne Berner representing the Community Arts Council requests the use of the Neosho
Riverwalk Amphitheater and allow the sale of alcohol for consumption for Sethfest scheduled for
October 14th from 11am to 10pm. After discussion Councilperson Sean Honer made a motion to
approve the request from the Community Arts Council. The motion was seconded by
Councilperson Denise Hartman. Motion carried 5 – 0

• CCLIP Project Programming Request:

City Administrator Jones spoke to the Council regarding the CCLIP Project Programming Request from KDOT, which will provide a 2in Mill N Overlay from 4th Street to East city limits. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$505,000 with \$400,000 coming from the KDOT CCLIP funding. The other \$105,000 would come from CCLIP gas tax Council Grove received from the State to help with costs not covered by the KDOT CCLIP funding. Councilperson Jason Booker made a motion to approve the

CCLIP Project Programming Request. The motion was seconded by Councilperson Mark Berner. Motion carried 5-0

City Administrator Jones asked the Council to move forward with speaking to Architect Ben Moore to obtain plans for restoration and estimates to apply for grants to start restoration. Councilperson Mark Berner made a motion to approve the request. The motion was seconded by Councilperson Jason Booker. Motion carried 5-0.

The City Lake Committee recommends the Council approve a new septic system request for C-19, Contingent on the following guidelines.

Bruce and Nancy Arnold C-19, 104 Breezy Shores Circle

- System must be located at the location discussed with City Lake Committee and approved by Council.
- Must have 2 foot of sand under lateral field.
- Must have 1 foot of rock around the lateral chambers.
- Must have 1 foot or more of dirt over the top of chambers.
- Sign annual agreement




AGREEMENT FOR PLACEMENT OF SEPTIC SYSTEM ON CITY OWNED PROPERTY


This agreement is made between <u>Bruce & Nancy Arnold</u> ("Leaseholder") and the City of Council Grove ("City") for the purpose of allowing Leaseholder to locate a septic system on property owned by the City of Council Grove, within Council Grove City Lake Park, generally referred to as "commons area." Said commons area lies outside the leased property of Leaseholder.

- 1. Leaseholder is the current lessee of Section C Lot 19 of Council Grove Lake Park.
- 2. Leaseholder has provided City with engineered drawings and mapping of the system which are attached to this agreement.
- 3. Leaseholder agrees to pay as an annual fee \$.25 per square foot (3,732 Sq Ft) for the land usage as shown on said drawing/map, for a total annual payment of \$933.00 per year.
- 4. This fee shall be due in full on or before January 15 each year. The current year's payment will be prorated from the date of signing this agreement. Prorated amount to be paid as of, Oct 4, 2023, \$222.38
- 5. Leaseholder agrees to abandon the septic system and connect to City water and sewer systems if that becomes available at any time while this agreement is in effect.
- 6. Leaseholder will be responsible for any maintenance and upkeep of the septic system.
- 7. City agrees to provide unrestricted access to the septic system for installation and maintenance.
- 8. Remove old septic tank and lateral field.
